

2026 SERIES



AMATEUR SHOWJUMPER OF THE YEAR

Jumping NSW will be endeavouring to run and administer the Amateur Jumping Series this year with a number of shows throughout NSW. For the series to run 10 classes need to be held.

About the Series

- The annual series of shows hosting qualifying events will run throughout the calendar year in NSW.
- The horse/rider's **six best performances** will decide the series winner.
- Scores will be based on a Horse/rider combination.
- Class heights in the first round in outdoor competitions can range between 1.15m to 1.20m depending on the type of arena, and the standard of the show. Indoor arenas can be first round 1.10m but not exceeding 1.15m. This should be stated on the show schedules.
- Participants must meet the criteria of the current National Amateur Ruling.
- All events will be run as Art 220.2.1.2 (Jump Off), Art 218.1.5 & Art 220.2.1.1 (Immediate Jump Off) or Art 221.3.3.1 (Competition over Two Rounds)
- The overall winner of the series will receive a rug and their name on the Jumping NSW Perpetual Trophy.
- The Events should have "Jumping NSW Amateur of the Year Class" in the title and advertised in show programs and entry systems.
- The first 10 places in each competition will gain points. With the winner of the class gaining 11 points then 2nd 9, 3rd 8 etc down to 10th 1 point.
- If there is an equality of points at the end of the series the horse/rider combination that places highest in the Summer Classic Amateur Class will be the overall series winner. (Addition to rules 4/1/18)
- Some shows may run the JNSW series class on the final with top 20 horses, please be aware that there may be a qualifying event for these classes that you will have to compete in to be able to compete

Australian Amateur Ruling

Article 205.3.1 – Amateur Rider classes are classes for riders who:

- Must not have competed in an Olympic Games or World Equestrian Games in either Jumping or Eventing
 - In the past 10 years must not have competed in a World Cup for Jumping Riders qualifying round or in a 5* 3 day event.
 - Must not have competed in section 1 and 2 at a Royal Show in Sydney, Brisbane, Melbourne, Adelaide or Perth in the past two years
 - Amateur Riders may not compete in an Amateur class if they compete in a class where the first round is higher than 1.20m at that show.
 - Amateur Riders may not compete in an Amateur class on a horse that will compete in any class where the first round is higher than 1.20m at that show.
- 1.1 Athletes must meet the membership requirements as set out in the EA General Regulations.
 - 1.2 Riders may compete as amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 21 years of age.
